BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING December 17, 2022

Meeting Location – Via online video conference

Board meeting was called to order by Jerry Geiger at 8:07 am. The invocation was led by Phil Frandsen.

MINUTES OF November 17, 2022 MEETING: Jason moved to approve the minutes as emailed to the board and posted to the club website. Seconded by Tim. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Tim presented the November 2022 financials. Bills that were paid this past month were the club phone (\$19.99), bank fees (\$2.28), Office Max for club supplies (\$92.00), Home Depot (\$11.59) and C&L Engraving for member badge (\$27.00). Membership renewals received in November was \$25.00. The club had farm income of \$4,204 for the sorghum from east field and \$1,996 for hay sales.

The Case account balance is \$12,205.55

STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS:

FARMLAND: Ed reported that the cover crop study with the University of Arizona is doing extremely well. Upon the soil inspection, earth worms were detected which is an excellent achievement for the soil. Alfalfa hasn't been cut because the field is too wet but Ed and Lonnie are keeping an eye on it with the pending frost. The rye that was planted in with the alfalfa is doing great and will help make some nice bales once it matures.

AHAA – Phil inquired on any donated tractors to the club. Jerry reported that he took in a tractor (early '30's Case) from the Art Moyer collection. Jerry has spent about \$50 on repairs to the tractor and hopes to have it running for the Glendale show to put it in the auction. If it doesn't sell, it will be transported to the auction at the AJ show in March.
